SCHOLARSHIPS DUE MARCH 15TH!

Ashland Co Farm Bureau is distributing a total of \$3,000 in scholarships via the Ashland County Community Foundation for 2018. Please share of this scholarship opportunity with any Ashland County youth that will be studying in an agriculture-related field in the fall of 2018! To apply, go to communityfoundation.org and complete the application online.

Scholarship details: Scholarships are awarded to assist graduating high school seniors and current college students that are residents of Ashland County or have graduated from any Ashland County high school who have a GPA of 2.5 or higher and have been accepted to an accredited two or four year college/university. Only those majoring in an agricultural related field

will be considered. Students will be evaluated on extracurricular activities, work experience and communication based on essay. Additional points will be awarded for students involved in agriculture related extracurricular activities and students who are members or dependents of members of the Ashland County Farm Bureau. Past recipients may reapply.

BAKER RE-ELECTED TO SERVE THIRD TERM FOR THE OHIO FARM BUREAU FEDERATION

Roger Baker of Wooster has been re-elected as District 8 trustee for the Ohio Farm Bureau Federation. During his third three-year term, he will help govern the state's largest general farm organization and represent Farm Bureau members from Ashland, Medina, Summit and Wayne counties. His re-election took place Dec. 8 during Ohio Farm Bureau's 99th annual meeting.

A 27-year member of Wayne County Farm Bureau, Baker has served as a county board trustee and chairman of the public policy committee and is a past vice president of the board. In 2001, he was an OFBF Discussion Meet finalist and participated in a trade mission to Europe in 2000. He also has served on the Wayne County Extension Advisory Committee and the state Extension Advisory Committee.

Baker graduated from Ohio State University Agricultural Technical Institute with an associate's degree in agricultural business and agronomy. He and his wife Diane are parents of a daughter, Mary, and they raise row crops and hay and have a small beef cow herd.



WATER QUALITY POSES A MAJOR TOPIC IN 2018

2017 held many agricultural policy victories for Ohio with the reformulation of the CAUV formula being one of the most notable which should bring property tax relief to Ohio farmers over the next six years. As we look to 2018, water quality continues to pose a major topic for Farm Bureau. Ohio Farm Bureau has been active in addressing this topic over the last 4 years and released the 2017 water quality status report in June. This report highlighted the efforts of local farmers in improving water quality through fertilizer application training, use of cover crops, waste management plans, and research and development on their properties. These efforts have been recognized and Ohio Farm Bureau has been asked to contribute details on Ohio farmer's voluntary efforts to reduce P levels in Lake Erie in the Ohio action plan required by the federal EPA. Research and volunteer efforts will continue into 2018 so keep an eye on your Buckeye Farm News for policy updates from Ohio Farm Bureau!
