Attending local meetings, sitting on advisory teams or even serving as a member of the OFBF State Policy Development Committee are just some of the opportunities available to be part of setting OFBF's policy positions.

ADVOCACY TO IMPROVE FOOD PRODUCTION

- ✓ Farm Bureau works regularly with its partners in the business community to ensure Ohio laws allow private enterprise to thrive. Working to reform Ohio's tax code, providing a sustainable unemployment compensation program and reforming our state's workers' compensation laws are just a few of the issues where Farm Bureau leverages these key partnerships to add the perspective of the food production sector.
- ✓ Farm Bureau support was crucial to passing legislation to avert the formation of a patchwork of 50 state food labeling requirements.

 Instead, a new national standard was established to provide food processors options for how to present information on GMO products to consumers.
- ✓ The federal Food Safety Modernization Act will mean tremendous changes for the food supply chain. Farm Bureau helped shape the
 - legislation to ensure the first overhaul of food safety laws since the 1930s was workable for the farm and food community. Farm Bureau will be a leader in providing its members with compliance resources to foster understanding of the new law's complex requirements.
- ✓ Surveys show consumers hold both food processors and farmers accountable for the integrity of the food they consume. Farm Bureau is the best forum to connect producers and processors in order to respond to consumer needs.
