


New Mexico and Colorado Western Ag and Cultural Tour June 14-19, 2026

Day 2 (Monday, June 15) - After breakfast, take a short walking tour of the historic town of Santa Fe. You can see the oldest church in the U.S, the San Miguel Chapel among other famous adobe built structures while walking on the city's old Spanish streets. Lunch will be a hands-on cooking class at the Santa Fee School of Cooking where you can learn to create a traditional Southwestern meal. Visit with the local extension service in the afternoon for a farm visit.

Day 3 (Tuesday, June 16) - Depart for Antonito, Colorado to board a full day historic train ride along 64 miles of scenic landscapes of southern Colorado and northern New Mexico. Lunch will be provided on the train route. Upon arrival into Chama, transfer to your centrally located hotel in Durango, Colorado visiting a yak and sheep farm before arriving in Durango. This small city is known for its Railroad Museum, tasty local restaurants and breweries.

Day 4 (Wednesday, June 17) - In the morning after breakfast, take a panoramic bus tour of Mesa Verde National Park. This UNESCO World Heritage site is filled with preserved Ancestral Puebloan cliff dwellings and other archaeological sites. After lunch on your own, have free time in Durango or visit one of the cattle ranches nearby Durango. Experience a Western style chuckwagon event for dinner filled with traditional comfort food and live music.

Day 5 (Thursday, June 18) - Check out of the hotel in the morning and travel through Navajo Nation lands to Santa Ana Pueblo, an area of over 73,00 acres east and west of the Rio Grande for some free time for lunch. En route visit with representatives from the Navajo Agricultural Products Industry (NAPI) to visit grain farms and facilities throughout their native lands. Continue to Santa Ana afternoon, experience the culture of this region with a local artisan demonstration and sample huruna—traditional bread of the pueblo, with a variety of butters and preserves,
