Stop 1 – Brady Vineyards of Ohio – 52185 Griggs Rd, Wellington

Brady Vineyards of Ohio is part of our 140-acre family farm in southern Lorain County in Rochester Township. We have 14 acres of wine grapes which we started planting in 2017. During this past growing season, we harvested 35,000 pounds of grapes by hand and are producing approximately 15,000 bottles of wine in our new



Heron Creek Winery. Come enjoy tastings and wine by the glass or bottle. We won 6 medals at the 2022 Ohio Wine Competition and had 4 wines certified as Ohio Quality Wine. We have seating and an outdoor patio. We also have a gift shop. We make custom gift baskets for any occasion. We sell wine grape jelly too. There are decorative wine glasses, wine glass holders, bottle covers, many gift bags and more. We also have Brady Vineyards and Heron Creek T-shirts and mugs. Our Facebook page

Stop 2 – Riverhill Farm – 52104 Stewart Rd, New London



Lee & Kelly Squire began farming here in 2007 and named their farm Riverhill Farm. The family focuses on exhibition poultry and a small cow-calf operation. Their passion for raising exhibition poultry began with Lee when he was in 4-H. Lee has passed on his enthusiasm to his children and wife. The farm works year around to maintain quality and condition in their poultry. They breed to the standards set forth by the American Poultry Association. The family looks forward to showing poultry at open shows throughout the United States.



Their favorite show of the year is the Lorain County Fair.

The cow-calf beef operation consists of Herefords and Shorthorns. Their calves are sold as feed calves to be finished for market. The Squire Family has recently built a manure-pack barn. The barn was designed specifically for longevity and comfort of the cattle.

The Ohio State University Extension- Lorain County and the Lorain County JVS FFA Chapter will each have an informational table set-up at this stop.

Stop 3 – Lone Tree Stables – 46924 Stewart Rd, New London

Lone Tree Stables is owned by Joanne May & Mike Cahill. Joanne & Mike both grew up around horses- Joanne, born in the United Kingdom went to Cambridge College of Agriculture. She is certified in horse husbandry, and instructing through the British Horse Society. She then worked and trained horses until she moved to the United States in 1993. Mike's parents had a small



beef farm near Medina and he was always around horses then started steer wrestling in the rodeo. Recently they purchased a training center in southern Lorain County, Lone Tree Stables. On the day of the fall farm tour they will be having riding and horse handling sessions throughout the day. Joanne will be available for all of your equestrian questions you may have!

Reisinger Farms, who have done all of Lone Tree's custom baling, will have a booth set up selling their beef and have information on their hay they have for sale. Kaufman Apiary will have a booth with honey and many honey related products for sale.



Stop 4 – Stumpwater Farm – 29499 Clark Rd, Sullivan

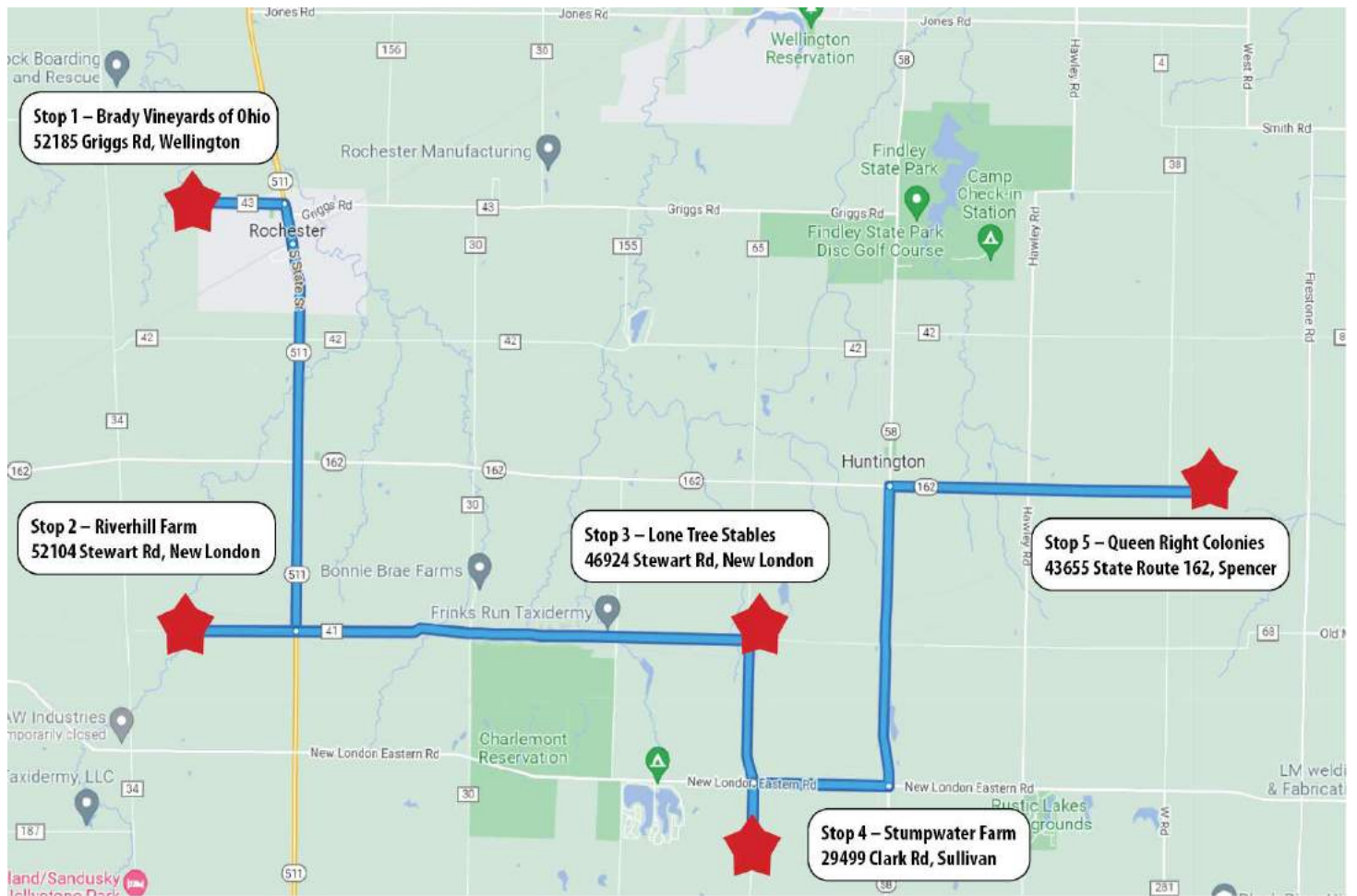

Stop 5 – Queen Right Colonies – 43655 State Rt. 162, Spencer

Queen Right Colonies and Das Amish Haus is located on the very southern edge of Lorain County nestled on a scenic 17-acre & 130-year old dairy farm. The barn and pastures are now occupied by a variety of deer, alpacas, fox and much, much more. The Amish house is a hand built 30-year old structure, referred to as an 'Amish starter home'. It was once occupied by Frances & Jacob Hershberger and now proudly serves as a quaint antique and gift shop. Queen Right Colonies (QRC) is a family-owned business with 5 generations working to help people keep bees healthy and thriving. Stop 2 will be on right/ north side of road.

Directions from Stop 2 to Stop 3
 Head east on Stewart Rd
 Continue straight on Stewart Rd
Stop 3 will be on left/ north side of road.

Stop 3 – Lone Tree Stables
46924 Stewart Rd, New London

Directions from Stop 3 to Stop 4

Turn right onto Stewart Rd
 Turn left onto Clark Rd
 Continue on Clark Rd
Stop 4 will be on left/east side of road.

Stop 4 – Stumpwater Farm
29499 Clark Rd, Sullivan

Directions from Stop 4 to Stop 5
 Head north on Clark Rd
 Turn right onto New London Eastern Rd
 Turn left onto OH-58 N
 Continue on State Rt. 58
 Turn right onto OH-162

Stop 5 will be on the right/south side of road
