

Logan County <u>Agriculture Impact Fund</u> **Mini-Grant Application**

About:

The Logan County Agriculture Impact Fund was founded in 2018 to provide agriculture enrichment opportunities to the youth of Logan County. The grant was established by the Logan County Farm Bureau and is generated through the Logan County Farm Bureau Reverse Raffle event.

Purpose:

These grants are in amounts of up to \$500.00 for agriculture education and promotional projects involving youth in Logan County Ohio. The purpose of the fund is to support projects and events that will expand and grow agriculture's footprint in the county.

Eligibility:

Grants are offered to any organization/school in Logan County Ohio that promotes the importance of agriculture and supports youth interested in learning more about the industry. The grant will be evaluated on a competitive basis. Projects submitted for the grant **MUST** be completed by the 2024 year-end.

Grant Timeline:

- Application period will be from February 1 to May 15, 2024.
- Upon submission grants will go through a two-tiered approval process. Recipients will be notified within 10 days of submission regarding their success in the application process.
- Completed project reports will be due to the committee by November 30, 2024.

Application Guidelines:

- <u>Grants must be submitted electronically by deadline. No paper submissions will</u> <u>be reviewed</u>. Please forward this to <u>jsmith@ofbf.org</u> or logan@ofbf.org.
- Applications for 2024 must be received by May 15, 2024.
- Those projects selected for a grant will receive one-half of the grant dollars at the beginning of the project and the balance upon completion of the project and the submission of a final report to the Impact Fund committee regarding the success of the project.
- An organization may only submit 1 application in a cycle.
- Funding is not available for mileage, wages/benefits, and meals and preference will be given to those projects that create a long-term impact.
- Grant applicants working with multiple institutions or in partnerships must show written agreement of the proposed project with their submission.
- Grant payments can only be made to organizations that are 501c3. Payments CANNOT be made to individuals or other organizations.

Selection Criteria:

All applications MUST be for agriculture education programs. All applications will be screened for compliance with the grant proposal guidelines, and any grant that does not meet the guidelines will be eliminated from the judging process before review. The following areas are eligible for disqualification:

- Applicant failing to follow directions.
- Applications submitted past the deadline.
- The application does not meet the basic requirements of the grant principles.

All applications meeting the guidelines will be evaluated by a panel of judges. Each evaluator will be asked to score the applications according to the following criteria:

The project enhances learner engagement in the agricultural industry, in Ohio and Logan County Ohio.	30 Points
The project will engage youth and encourage their involvement in and learn more about agriculture.	20 Points
The project application is complete and has defined: Plans, Goals, Timeline, and Budget.	20 Points
The project expands on current ag education efforts.	20 Points
The project provides a new and innovative way to showcase agriculture topics and themes.	10 Points
