AgriPOWER leadership, advocacy program accepting applications



AGRIPOWER

AgriPOWER is a program of Ohio Farm Bureau and designed for farmers and agribusiness professionals. Applications must be submitted by Aug. 1, 2024.

In 2024, Ohio Farm Bureau Federation will select individuals to participate in AgriPOWER, a leadership and advocacy development program, which will consist of seven multi-day institutes (17 total days). AgriPOWER is a program of Ohio Farm Bureau and designed for farmers and agribusiness professionals.

The AgriPOWER program focuses on public issues that are relevant to the food industry such as consumer relations, regulations, energy, and trade policies. In AgriPOWER, individuals develop the skills necessary to become effective leaders and advocates for agriculture by learning from experts in these fields.

Two of the institute sessions will be held out of state (one in Washington, D.C., and the other location will be decided at a later date) to help class members gain a valuable understanding of national and global issues.

Individuals may nominate themselves or have their nomination sponsored by their respective county Farm Bureau, other agricultural organization, or employer. All applicants must be Farm Bureau members. Applications must be submitted by Aug. 1, 2024.

By opting in to Membership Auto-Renew, you authorize Ohio Farm Bureau on an annual basis to:

 Charge the applicable membership rate to the saved payment method on your member profile and renew your Farm Bureau membership.

Once enrolled in Auto-Renew:

- Your saved payment method will be processed on the 20th of the month your membership expires.
- You will receive an annual reminder email 10 days in advance of the date your dues payment will be processed.
- You may cancel your participation in Auto-Renew and avoid incurring the annual dues charge by opting out via your online membership account, no later than 2 business days before the scheduled dues processing date.
