An in-person night with Temple Grandin presented by Portage Co Farm Bureau

Dr. Grandin will be speaking on animal behavior and her humane methods of handling animals for processing. In North America, almost half of the cattle are handled in a Grandin-designed system. She has designed chutes, loading ramps, corrals and stockyards for local farmers such as Bonner Farms Beef and Market (Portage) and The Ohio State University Agricultural Technical Institute in Wooster as well as national and international producers such as McDonald's, Texas Pride Processing and clients in Canada, Europe, Mexico, Australia and New Zealand.

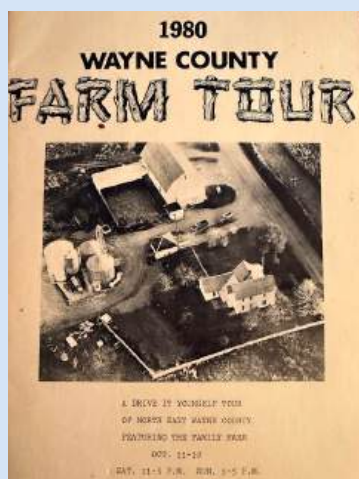
History of the Wayne County Farm Tour

A question by Ohio Farm Bureau staff about the history of the Wayne County Farm Tour for the Jan/Feb 2026 edition of the Our Ohio magazine led us down an interesting rabbit hole. We thought the membership would appreciate us sharing. If you have past tour brochures or more details about the history of the Wayne County Farm Tour, please share them with us!

The Wayne County Farm Tour was started by the Wooster Camera Club in 1966 and, sometime around 1970, a group called the "Ag Leaders" took over organizing the tour. In 1979, the tour did not take place but Wayne Co Farm Bureau took on the event in 1980 and has organized it ever since. It has been on the second weekend of October and rotated counter clockwise around the 4 quadrants of the county since 1980. To our knowledge, the tour has taken place every October since 1966 with the exception of 1979 and 2020.

The Wayne Co Farm Bureau volunteers who were instrumental in continuing this event after the 1979 pause were Fred Finney, Becky Workerger and Becky Leatherman. The early years of the tour were dedicated in memory of Becky Leatherman, as she tragically passed away in a car accident. Fred went on to become the District 8 State Trustee for Ohio Farm Bureau from 1984-1992 and Ohio Farm Bureau President 1989-1992. Becky Workerger was involved with the Wayne County Farm Bureau Women's Committee and Farm Tour committee in the 1980's and again in the 2000's.

A few memories that Fred and Becky have of the 1980 farm tour - it snowed on the Saturday of the farm tour. The first stop was in Smithville at the Landmark Cooperative. They had many people arrive early wondering where the bus was (they didn't realize it was a drive-it-yourself tour). For a number of years, school groups attended the tour on Friday as a field trip. The tour booklet also featured the church services that visitors could attend near the tour on Sunday morning if they were coming in from out of town.

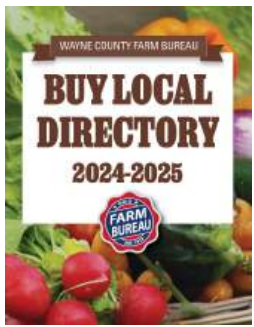

2026 Wayne County Farm Bureau and Ohio Farm Bureau Scholarships

Wayne County Farm Bureau is pleased to offer members and dependents of members the opportunity to apply for scholarships through the Ohio Farm Bureau Foundation. In 2026, at least \$3,000 will be awarded to applicants enrolled in a 2 or 4 year program in the fall. The application deadline for a Wayne County Farm Bureau scholarship is March 31.

Additionally, the Ohio Farm Bureau Foundation offers 17 scholarships of their own each year. Its newest and most prestigious scholarship opportunity is the Ohio Farm Bureau Ambassadors Scholarship. This premier scholarship honors exceptional students who demonstrate academic excellence, meaningful community service, and a commitment to pursuing careers that advance Ohio agriculture. The scholarship provides one renewable award of \$10,000, supporting a student pursuing a degree in agriculture or an agriculture-related field. The application for this scholarship is Feb 28.
